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FUNDING FOR PROJECTS

Having taken further legal advice August last year, we believe that we are **now** able to move forward regarding disbursement of the money that was collected in the past for Easements.

In brief, money was collected legally in line with the Countryside Right of Way Act passed in 2000, but after legal challenges the Act was repealed in 2006. The Council has acted as 'guardian' of the funds, waiting to establish the continued legality of fund ownership/how funds may be spent and whether any case law came about in the six years after the Act was revoked.

All the funds must be used for the benefit of the parish community; some must be applied to capital projects (ie not one-off events). We must seek the optimum benefits over the long-term for the village and its parishioners but there is no obligation for us to spend all the money immediately. In fact doing so would cause concern to auditors as we have to prove we have considered 'value added' for the community. As most of the serving Councillors have interests re. village organisations, we are obliged to obtain dispensations before formal debate as 'our' organisations may benefit financially.

Proper time must be allocated for discussions; an initial, special Council meeting took place in June. The Council anticipate a further special meeting in November to consider any applications received.

The criteria for Clavering Parish Council Funding for Projects are:

- Only Clavering Clubs/Organisations/Individuals are eligible to apply.
- Funding is for projects that would benefit the Clavering Club/Organisation/Individuals over a period of years.
 - Funding will not be given for ongoing costs or projects which have already taken place.
 - Clavering Parish Council may consider shared funding for larger projects.
- Applicants will be required to provide Clavering Parish Council with copies of their constitution and accounts for the previous 2 years (where applicable).
 - Clavering Parish Council asks to be acknowledged in all publicity and advertising.
 - Clavering Parish Council's decision as to whether to award funding will be final.
